SUMMARY OF THE REASONS FOR DECISION:

The 35mm Film *Scooby-Doo* was originally cross-rated by the Film and Video Labelling Body as "Unrestricted: Suitable for General Audiences". The film was submitted for reclassification by a member of the public on 31 July 2002. The film was examined and the classification altered to "Unrestricted: Parental Guidance Recommended for Younger Viewers" due to low-level scenes of cartoon-like horror and violence which may disturb younger children.
